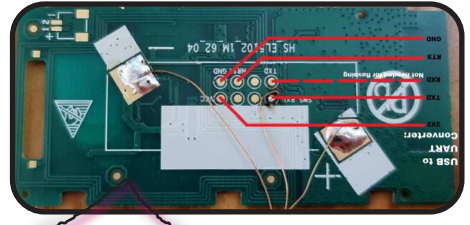


Soldering tiny cables. It goes all smooth when prepared, everything coated in tin, some flux and a soldering stand helping us along the way.

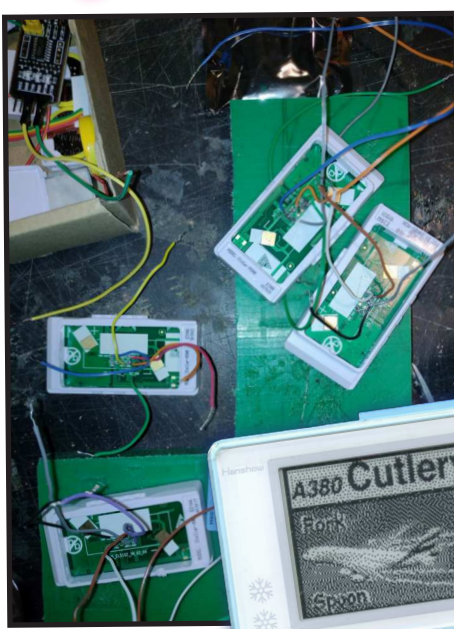

Open the flash tool in Microsoft Edge (my apologies, Firefox is adjusted to strong privacy settings) Connect to the serial USB converter, first, unlock the flash, write the .bin after that.



A USB to UART converter will help us with that.

The .bin needs to be compiled on your computer. Run makeit.exe in E:\stellar-L3N-etag-main\Firmware.

- 200x200.bin
- Chinese Original.bin
- fix your resolution ATC_Paper.bin
- ORIGINAL.bin

Let's say it works on 70% of our available Stellar models. It comes with a slightly adjusted firmware.

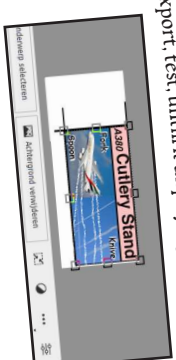


Rice Cooker Lid
